Butterflies hold a special place in my heart. When one flutters by, I feel a special presence and am often reminded of my deceased father and other loved ones gone before me. My forever friend, Belinda Jane, and I share admiration for the wonderful, winged wonders. Our dearly departed Mary C. would often include "butterfly kisses" in her texts.

I was recently drawn to Rev. Dr. Marcia McFee's worship

series called "Emerge" with a butterfly as the prominent symbol. Attention is given to the metamorphosis moments of crawling caterpillar to chrysalis (or cocoon) to colorful creature. From the series we are reminded or learn that...Within a caterpillar are "imaginal discs" – amazing groupings of dormant cells that have all the information needed to move ahead and form and perform as a beautiful butterfly.

It takes 10-14 days for a butterfly to fully form inside a chrysalis, and then the casing splits open and the new creature must begin to emerge. The butterfly's struggle to push out of its confines produces a fissure that cannot be undone. There is no going back, the journey to what comes next has begun.

Some might say that butterflies look ugly when fresh out of the chrysalis. They appear wrinkled in the way our skin wrinkles when it is submerged in water for a period. They certainly cannot fly yet. The butterfly must allow air to dry out its wings and for the wings to expand. A fascinating thing to notice in the emergence of a butterfly is how much larger it is when it is done unfolding. It's much larger than the chrysalis that encased it.

Imagine the metaphorical messages or questions the literal life of a butterfly might have for us personally and collectively as followers of Jesus...

What "imaginal discs" are already within us that can move us into the next phase of life? Are we cocooning, contemplating? Is there a crack in our chrysalis? Is it time to emerge and expand?
