South Grand Lake is a place of beauty and movement—a space where many come to rest, reconnect, and renew. The water doesn't always sit still; it shimmers, stirs, and sometimes swells. And not far from its everchanging edge, where water meets land in rhythms both gentle and wild, is a church with a message both bold and tender: "Love — It's a Shore Thing."

This is more than a lakeside slogan. It's a way of being. A living truth that shapes every part of this faith community which is anchored in the way of Jesus. Here, love is expansive and ever-reaching—like the lake itself. It flows to everyone, no matter where you are, geographically or spiritually.

The shoreline is more than a backdrop—it's a symbol. Just as the water is always in motion, this church is always reaching toward the margins. Just as the lake is deep and wide, so is the grace that defines this community.

South Grand Lake Christian Church honors tradition while leaning boldly into the present. It's a church where love doesn't ask for credentials or conditions. Where you don't have to prove your worth, hide your questions, or check your identity at the door. Whether you're filled with faith, full of doubt, or somewhere in between—you are welcome. You are essential. You belong.

This community understands that love isn't static. It moves. It shows up. It listens. It acts. Whether you live lakeside, in a city, out in the country, near or far —this is a place where your story matters. Where community feels like family. We're not perfect, we focus on presence.

Serving is at the heart of this congregation's life. Not out of obligation, but out of inspiration to help make God's love real. Whether in person or online, folks are encouraged to bring their gifts to the table—to be part of something bigger, to help mend what's broken and nurture what's growing.

This is also a place that honors rest. Because life isn't just about what we do—it's about who we are. Here, rest is holy. There's space to pause, to breathe, to be. You don't need to earn your place. You already have one.

Each week, both in person and online, people gather not to be judged, but to be reminded of who they are: beloved, needed, included. Worship here is simple and sacred—guitar-led music, honest prayer, reflection rooted in scripture and alive with relevance. Words that don't seek to scare, but to stir. Ideas that challenge and comfort, calling people into a movement for wholeness in a fragmented world as we practice the sacred work of being human together.

If you're searching for a space where you can rest and rise, question and grow, speak and listen—know this: there's a place for you here. A place where love is more than a word or a wish.

Here, love is lived.

Here, love is wide, deep, and always moving. Here, love is a *shore* thing.
